Prior to use, the lantern must be turned on.



Twist the lid (top of lantern) counterclockwise, and remove from the body of the lantern. On the underside of the lid, there is an On/Off switch. Move the switch to "On", and place lid back on the lantern by turning clockwise.

To replace the battery:

Unhook the lantern from the statue, and remove the lid from the lantern by twisting it counterclockwise. Battery type: Ni-MH AAA 200mAh 1.2V

Remove screws to replace the battery.

Trouble Shooting Tips:

If your solar light does not turn on at night, it may be caused by the following:

1. Check to see if the switch is in the "OFF" position.

Resolution: Move the switch to the "ON" position and allow the solar light to be charged for at least 8 hours in direct sunlight.

2. Battery may not be fully charged.

Resolution: Make sure the solar light is placed in an area where the solar panel receives the maximum amount of full direct sunlight every day.

- 3. The solar light may be located too close to other light sources (such as porch light or street lantern). **Resolution:** Relocate away from external light source.
- The rechargeable battery may need to be replaced.
 Resolution: Replace with batteries of identical specification.



Do not dispose of batteries in the regular trash, municipal waste stream or by fire as batteries may leak or explode. Do not open, short circuit, or mutilate batteries as injury may occur. Preserve our environment by recycling batteries or disposing of them in accordance with Local, State, and Federal regulations.
